# **EXPORTS GLOBALLY**

The South African furniture manufacturing industry is a relatively small industry with sales of R13.9bn in 2012. The industry has been under pressure for a number of years following the global recession and growing competition from cheaper Asian imported furniture. Rising input costs and underinvestment in technology and skills development is further limiting the growth of the industry. Due to the potential of the furniture manufacturing sector for job generation, especially in the rural

areas, it has been the focus of government interventions such as skills development and business incubation in an effort to support new entrants to the industry.
